Each week at Saylorville Church, following the exposition of a given passage from Scripture, a small group of individuals then take the message to deeper levels of truth and its application. The questions below are intended to provoke discussion among our Cell Groups. The intention is not that every question is pursued but that each leader, using the following questions as a guide, interacts with their particular group.

My Plans. God's Promises.

Review:

- 1. Read 2 Corinthians 1:15-22
- 2. What is the main idea of the passage?
- 3. What was the main idea of the message?

Application:

- 1. Who has permission to call out your unfaithfulness to God and His Word in your life? If so, how effective has this specific accountability relationship been for you?
- 2. How are you expressing joy for what Christ has done for you?
- 3. Looking at the past few weeks, how would you describe your trust in God's Promises?
- 4. Where is God challenging you and changing you right now?
- 5. Share an example of a time in which you made a commitment but were not able to follow through on your word. Do you feel like your trust was compromised? What did God teach you through this situation?
- 6. In what area of your life do you struggle most with being faithful and trustworthy? Why? What does God need to change in your life to improve this area of struggle?
- 7. God doesn't ask us to clean up our mess in order to be changed; He changes us so we can clean up our mess! How has God been changing you for the better recently? How has this change helped you to "clean up your mess?"
- 8. God is immutable (unchanging over time) but not inflexible. Share an example from God's word that illustrates this truth. How have you personally experienced these attributes of God?
- 9. What is the meaning of the following phrase in 2 Corinthians 1:20: "For all the promises of God find their 'Yes' in him." (My joy for all God has done for me in Christ should give way to expressions like "yes" and "amen" because they: secure us, anoint us and guarantee us.)
- 10. What specific promises of God are you claiming today? What specific promises of God are you having a difficult time claiming today?
- 11. Pray together, sharing expressions of joy for all God has done for you in Christ.
