Review:

1. Read 2 Corinthians 2:12-13
2. What is the main idea of the passage?
3. What was the main idea of the message?

Application:

1. Why is the illustration of a door such a powerful and fitting metaphor for Christ?
2. Share an example of a time in your life when you were pursuing one path and then something unexpected came up that began pulling you in a completely different direction. Did you maintain the same path or did you change direction? Why? How did that situation change you? What did God show you through those circumstances?
3. Pastor Pat stated that open doors do not in and of themselves constitute the call of God. Discuss an instance in which you were presented with an open door that was contrary to the call of God. How did you respond to that situation?
4. How is God knocking at the door of your heart today? How are you going to respond?
5. Have you prayed for opportunities to share Christ with someone recently? If so, how did God answer your prayer(s)?
6. Name 2-3 people with whom you desire to share the Gospel. What are the biggest obstacles preventing you from sharing the Gospel with these individuals? How can your Cell Group help you overcome these obstacles?
7. Pray together, asking God for opportunities to share Christ with someone this week and for boldness to follow through on those opportunities.
