## Review:

1. Read 2 Corinthians $3: 12-17$
2. What is the main idea of the passage?
3. What was the main point of the message?

Application:

1. What are your spiritual New Year's resolutions for 2016 ? Will you commit to reading your Bible five minutes every day before you leave your home this year? If not, what is holding you back? How can we keep each other accountable in this area?
2. Describe a time in which you were frustrated by someone's resistance to God. How did you handle that frustration?
3. Our hope in Christ should be evidenced by boldness, compassion and joy. Which of these three attributes do you exhibit the most, and which of these three attributes do you exhibit the least? Why are all three of these important?
4. What might be the result of approaching someone with boldness and no compassion? What about compassion without boldness? What about boldness without joy?
5. Looking over the past few months, how would you rate your boldness in the Gospel?
6. Share any successful or missed opportunities you had to share the Gospel during this Christmas season.
7. Pastor Pat stated that knowledge of God is the fuel for your soul. With that in mind, what level is your fuel gauge reading today? Is your "knowledge of God" fuel tank currently filling up or emptying?
8. As a Christian, what does it mean to have true, holy, biblical "freedom of speech?"
9. Who have you talked to lately that is spiritually blind? How did you talk to them?
