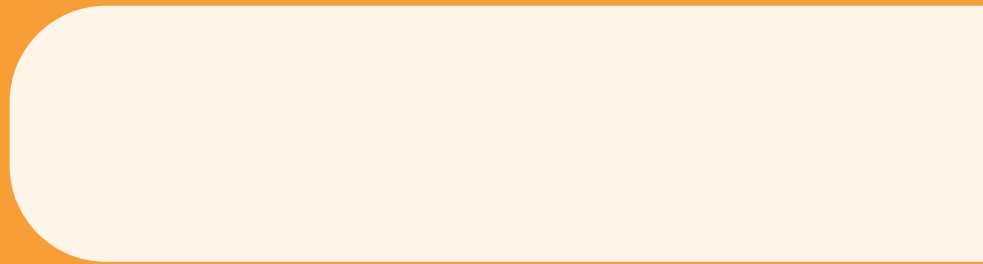

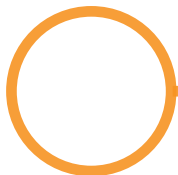

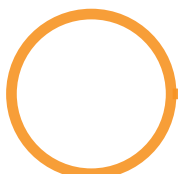

01

OBSERVATION.

The first step to meaningful Bible study is observing and engaging with the actual words of Scripture. In this step, we're trying to gain a basic understanding of what the text says. At this point in the study our goal is to ask questions, not jump to conclusions. Take on the role of detective by asking the right questions to get all the information we need to start interpreting the passage.

01

START WITH PRAYER

Start your study with prayer, asking God to help you see, understand, and apply His Word every time you open it. Transformation only comes from Him. This is an important step.

02

THINK ABOUT THE BOOK

The context of any verse, book, or passage you read needs to be a factor in how you interpret what you are reading. Every word of the Bible was written at a certain point in history, in the midst of a certain set of circumstances. The storyline of the Bible weaves through creation, the fall, redemption and finally, to restoration. Ask yourself where this book fits in the story of the Bible.

03

ASK THE SIX BIG QUESTIONS

Get in the habit of asking yourself: Who? What? Where? When? Why? How? Observation begins with a good keen sense of interrogation. Mark down geographic locations. Make note of the time. Understanding the historical context will allow you to garner new insights and therefore a deeper understanding.



04

IDENTIFY KEY WORDS & PHRASES

Identifying important words or short phrases in a passage will often shed light on the author's purpose for writing. Are there words that you don't understand? Underline them! Do you see phrases repeated? Mark them! Refer back to the "Resources" page to find more ideas on how to highlight words or phrases that might be important.

05


MAKE A LIST

Many of you are list makers. A list often helps to reveal a concept or idea the author is trying to unwrap. This is a big step for visual learners. For example, in Galatians 5, list out the fruit of the Spirit. Also, you can make a list of contrasts or comparisons that may be made. A list will reveal truth and highlight important insights.

06

LOOK FOR THE CHAPTER THEME

The theme of the chapter will bring all of the work you did in observation together. The lists, key words, phrases, people, and places will help you identify the theme. Write the theme as simply as possible, using words found in the passages you've studied.



02

INTERPRETATION.

The primary goal of this step of Bible study is to understand the author's intended meaning. To uncover the original writer's intent, we need to approach each passage with a literal, grammatical and historical perspective. Here's the key principle: when we come to a text, we should have the general attitude that all Scripture is to be taken and interpreted literally - unless we are given reason to believe otherwise from the context.

01

REMEMBER THE CONTEXT

Doing the work of observation will help you see the context of verses, surrounding verses, the book, and the whole Bible. Ask yourself if your interpretation is consistent with the theme you identified. Is it consistent with other Scripture? Did you consider the context of the original readers? Work hard to not take any verse out of context to make it say what you want. Discover the meaning intended by the original author.

02

USE YOUR CROSS REFERENCES

Commit to using other Scripture to support or challenge your findings as you interpret certain verses. Immerse yourself in Scripture; it will keep you grounded.

03

TRUST THE INSPIRED TEXT

All Scripture is inspired by God. As such, it's important to remember that it can never contradict itself. Even then, there can be difficult passages to reconcile together. In those moments we believe in faith what God says, even though we may not fully understand it.



04

DON'T LOOK FOR SHORTCUTS

There will be passages that are difficult to interpret, and you may be tempted to rush past those passages. Don't do that! Studying with patience requires a long-term view. In other words, it's okay to feel like you don't understand the Bible sometimes. Keep reading, keep looking at cross-references, and keep praying that God will reveal to you what He wants you know from each passage.

05


BE LITERAL

The words of Scripture are the very words of God. The Bible is truth. So, we can take it at face value. Don't get into a habit of looking for hidden meaning. Let the passage speak for itself.

06

PAY ATTENTION TO THE WRITING STYLE

Read the passage in light of the literary style of the book you are studying. Each writing style is unique and some are more metaphoric than others. Styles include: historical, law, poetic, wisdom, prophetic, epistles (letters), gospel and apocalyptic. Some books have several styles and genres within them.



03

APPLICATION.

There is saying that goes like this, “The Bible was not given for our information but for our transformation through its application.” This quote, often attributed to the American evangelist D.L. Moody, captures an important truth about our relationship with God’s Word. We don’t engage with the Bible simply to increase our knowledge about God. We read it, we study it, we memorize it, we think about it and we apply it in order to know God Himself. And as we do that, God’s Word - and God Himself - transforms us. The goal of Bible study is not simply to determine what it says and what it means, but to be changed by it. If we fail to apply the Scriptures, we cut short the entire process and have not finished what God wants us to do.

01

START BY SEEING IT

The first step to application is to see it. Only with God's help will we "see" or recognize application for our life. Ask God to help you "see it" so we can look more like Jesus as we live for Him.

02

IDENTIFY THE TRANSFORMING TRUTH

The truth we apply to our life often falls into one or more of these categories: truth to believe, promise to claim, command to obey, example to follow, prayer to pray or sin to confess. Identifying the truth to apply will help you put it into action.

03

JOURNAL YOUR THOUGHTS

One of the biggest roadblocks to application will be your own unbelief. Our own desires often cloud our thinking and effect our ability to look like Jesus. Write out your thoughts and the process of conviction as God reveals where He wants you to change or grow based on what you've read. Be honest with yourself and identify your sin and unbelief and ask for Holy Spirit power to overcome it in obedience.

04

DEVELOP A GROWTH PLAN

As the Holy Spirit guides you and prompts you, write out a plan to practically live out just exactly “what” God is moving you to apply in your life. Be specific and clear as you set attainable and practical goals.

05


FIND ACCOUNTABILITY

We need each other. Together is better. Community and accountability are vital to biblical application. Seriously consider with whom you will share your plan and commitments.

06

DO THE NEXT RIGHT THING

God has a way of taking our little and turning it into big. When we rely on the Holy Spirit, and commit to adjusting our lives to Jesus, God will grow us. Move forward in faith fully trusting tht God will complete the work that He started in you. Be sure to fill out a Growth Plan at the end of each week to help you do the next right thing.

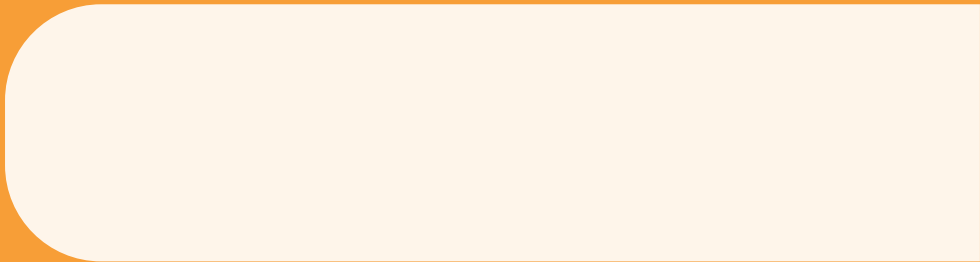
