## **Summer Camp 2019 Verses**

## THE BASICS

- The student may recite the verses in a different translation. (Translations that can be used: ESV, NIV, NKJV, NASB, HCSB)
- The student must know the verses and the references.
- The student has the option of splitting the verses they will be reciting into 2 sections.
- The student will be allowed up to 3 helps per section (6 helps total).

## Psalm 139:1-24 English Standard Version (ESV)

- <sup>1</sup>O Lord, you have searched me and known me!
- <sup>2</sup> You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from afar.
- <sup>3</sup> You search out my path and my lying down and are acquainted with all my ways.
- <sup>4</sup> Even before a word is on my tongue, behold, O Lord, you know it altogether.
- <sup>5</sup> You hem me in, behind and before, and lay your hand upon me.
- <sup>6</sup> Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is high; I cannot attain it.
- Where shall I go from your Spirit? Or where shall I flee from your presence?
- 8 If I ascend to heaven, you are there! If I make my bed in Sheol, you are there!
- <sup>9</sup> If I take the wings of the morning and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea,
- <sup>10</sup> even there your hand shall lead me, and your right hand shall hold me.
- <sup>11</sup> If I say, "Surely the darkness shall cover me, and the light about me be night,"
- <sup>12</sup> even the darkness is not dark to you; the night is bright as the day, for darkness is as light with you.
- <sup>13</sup> For you formed my inward parts; you knitted me together in my mother's womb.

- <sup>14</sup> I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; my soul knows it very well.
- <sup>15</sup> My frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately woven in the depths of the earth.
- <sup>16</sup> Your eyes saw my unformed substance; in your book were written, every one of them, the days that were formed for me, when as yet there was none of them.
- <sup>17</sup> How precious to me are your thoughts, O God! How vast is the sum of them!
- <sup>18</sup> If I would count them, they are more than the sand. I awake, and I am still with you.
- <sup>19</sup> Oh that you would slay the wicked, O God! O men of blood, depart from me!
- <sup>20</sup> They speak against you with malicious intent; your enemies take your name in vain.
- <sup>21</sup> Do I not hate those who hate you, O Lord? And do I not loathe those who rise up against you?
- <sup>22</sup> I hate them with complete hatred; I count them my enemies.
- <sup>23</sup> Search me, O God, and know my heart! Try me and know my thoughts!
- <sup>24</sup> And see if there be any grievous way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting!

## ------End here if student is taking sermon notes----- James 1:19-27 English Standard Version (ESV)

- <sup>19</sup> Know this, my beloved brothers: let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger; <sup>20</sup> for the anger of man does not produce the righteousness of God. <sup>21</sup> Therefore put away all filthiness and rampant wickedness and receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls.
- <sup>22</sup> But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. <sup>23</sup> For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror. <sup>24</sup> For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like. <sup>25</sup> But the one who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets but a doer who acts, he will be blessed in his doing.
- <sup>26</sup> If anyone thinks he is religious and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his heart, this person's religion is worthless. <sup>27</sup> Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world.
