## **CONNECT WITH YOUR GROUP (10-15 MINUTES)**

• Pastor Curt began by asking us, "How is it between you and Jesus today?" As a group, ask each other that same question as you begin your time together.

# **APPLY THE BIBLE (45-60 MINUTES)**

- Remember what you talked about last time. Is there anything you need to follow up on this week?
- Review your Sermon Notes together. What is one thing that sticks out to you about what you learned?
- Read this week's passage together. In his message, Pastor Curt encouraged us to cultivate a deep hunger and thirst for righteousness.

#### Context:

• In Matthew 5:6, Jesus recommends that we "hunger and thirst for righteousness", in part by feeding and focusing on the Word of God instead of the voice of Satan. Which of these voices do you usually "feed on"? Do you need to make any adjustments to your "diet" this week?

## **Steps for Hungering and Thirsting After Righteousness:**

- Read through **Psalm 63:1-6** slowly in several different Bible versions, review the steps below, then ask each other which is the most difficult and why:
  - 1. Earnest Seeking (vs. 1)
  - 2. Focused Looking (vs. 2)
  - 3. Mindful Meditating (vss. 3 and 6)
  - 4. Active Worshiping (vs. 4)
  - 5. Enjoyable Eating (vs. 5)
- Be honest, do you find yourself "hungering and thirsting" after a deeply intimate relationship with the Lord, or are you simply satisfied to have a reserved seat in Heaven when you die?
- At the close of his message, Pastor Curt said, "Jesus Christ is both the goal and the prize of our journey to heaven." Based on this, do you think Heaven itself should be the ultimate goal for the Christian? Why or why not? What is your ultimate goal?
