<u>Psalm 132</u> <u>December 14, 2025</u>

CONNECT WITH YOUR GROUP (10-15 MINUTES)

 What is one Christmas tradition that helps you refocus on Christ each year - and which tradition tends to distract you?

APPLY THE BIBLE (45-60 MINUTES)

- Remember what you talked about last time. Is there anything you need to follow up on this week?
- Review your Sermon Notes together. What is one thing that sticks out to you about what you learned?
- Read this week's passage together. In his message, Pastor Jason encouraged us to prepare room in our lives for God this Christmas by centering our celebration on Him.

This Christmas, Prepare Him Room by...:

- 1. Looking Back...to when God was at the center (Psalm 132:1-7)
 - · When you think of God's past faithfulness, what are some moments you remember?
 - Psalm 132 recalls David's zeal to build a dwelling place for God. What would it look like for you to re-center your life around the presence of God this season?
 - How can you build habits during December that help you rehearse God's trustworthy character rather than rehearse your anxieties?
- 2. Looking Inside...Is God at the center of my life? (Psalm 132:8-12)
 - Has God ever truly been at the center of your life? If so, describe that time. If not, why not?
 - Where do you see competing "kings" trying to claim authority in your life comfort, achievement, approval, control? What will you do to de-clutter and put Christ back at the center this week?
 - Bethlehem humble, tiny, and overlooked became the birthplace of the King. Where might God be at work in small, humble, or unlikely places in your life right now?
- 3. Looking Ahead...to when God will be at the center forever (Psalm 132:13-18)
 - Psalm 132 ends with joy, shining, and God dwelling with His people. Which of those future realities strengthens your faith most today and why?
 - How could meditating on eternity (Revelation 21–22) change how you celebrate Christmas this year?
 - If December is often busy or stressful, what practical steps can help you make worship, not activity, the center of your season?

Receive and Respond: What will I do because of what I just heard?

PRAY TOGETHER (5-15 MINUTES)

- Ask God to help you remember specific ways He has been faithful in your past and to trust Him for what's ahead.
- Pray that Christ would take His rightful place at the center of your thoughts, desires, and priorities this
- Pray for a deeper longing for Jesus' return and for the joy of His coming Kingdom to shape how you
 worship in December.
- Pray for someone in your life who needs the hope of the true King. Ask for boldness and compassion as you point them to Christ.
